



Foiling's Expanding Role in the Future for Sailing

I get questions about why Bristol Yacht Club is supporting wing foiling and so I thought I'd share this YouTube recording of a presentation at the Saint Francis Yacht Club in San Francisco discussing the progression and development of foiling and foil sailing at their club.

Delivered by the St. Francis Yacht Club Foil Sports Committee, the speakers for this presentation included StFYC Foil Committee Co-Chair Geoff Headington, two time kite boarding world champion Erika Heineken, and US Sail Team Member (1986-1988) Chris Radowski. The speakers explained how foils have evolved from their early use in individual boarding sports (wind surfing and kite boarding) through adoption in sailboats, originally in Moth sailing dinghies in the 70s and more recently and famously in the 2013America's Cup boats.

Want to learn to foil in Bristol Harbor? Here's how to get started.

EBSF offers private and group foiling lessons using their fleet of Skeeta and Nikki foiling boats. Learn more.

BYC is hosting three foil fest events on August 5, 12, and 19. These events are open to the public. Participants need to bring their own board and equipment. Learn more.

BYC Member Mark Wilcox organizes foiling clinics at BYC where foiling board manufacturers provide introductory training and boards for beginners to try out on the water. Contact Mark at Mark Wilcox markwilcox1010@gmail.com to learn more.

Today yacht clubs around the world are integrating foiling programs into their fleets and instructional programs to give people who want to push the limits of speed and excitement in their sailing experiences a forum to do so. As wind-powered foiling continues to penetrate mainstream sailing, world class competition among foiling athletes will gain steam. In fact, in 2024 foils will appear for the first time in Olympic sailing competitions, when 5 of the 10 sailing medals awarded at the Paris Olympics will be for foilenabled sailing events.

In an extensive Q&A at the end of the presentations, the speakers address a number of pragmatic questions about how to get started in foiling, including age considerations, learning curve factors, and equipment options.




At the StFYC WingDing Regatta in April, Bristol area foiler Jason Morton (pictured left front holding his yellow wing above his head) came in 3rd in the 45+ class and 23rd overall. BYC member Mark Wilcox (below)came in 4th in the 45+ class and 24th overall.

In the video there's also a lot of talk about the StFYC's WingDing Regatta which occurred in April 2023 and which drew 63 "riders." BYC member Mark Wilcox competed and finished 4th in the Silver fleet and 24th overall, and another in our Bristol fleet, Jason Morton, finished 3rd/23rd overall. The fast speeds, combined with the low cost of entry, are attracting younger sailors. BYC is doing well with 20 riders here for our regatta a few weeks ago, and 17 signed up for the 5 summer race day series.

Bristol Announces Sea Rise Flooding Project with URI's Coastal Resources Center

At an April dinner at BYC, two University of Rhode Island Coastal Resource Center resiliency experts, Pam Rubinoff and Thaïs Fournier, provided a provocative presentation that blended climate science with descriptions of storm modeling tools, including <u>STORMTOOLS</u> and the MyCoast app used to track and report high tides and storm damage. Their presentation documented how Bristol is increasingly impacted by low-lying nuisance flooding from storms and sea level rise. In response, the town of Bristol has partnered with the Coastal Resources Center & RI Sea Grant to document flooding in Bristol. The URI Coastal Resources Center's specialists have asked for volunteers to record flooding and erosion and report through the <u>MyCoast app</u>. Interested club members can contact Thaïs M.
