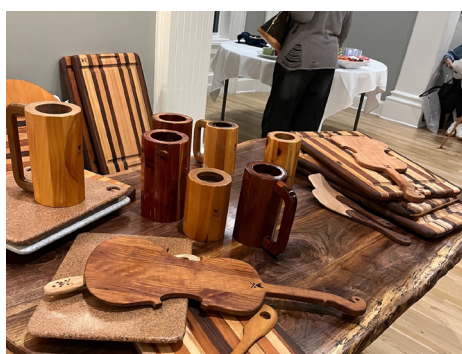

The process for taking advantage of these reciprocal privileges is easy: Ask Chief Steward Chris Healey for a letter of introduction (see example), which you can then use in your communication with the club you would like to visit. The letter both confirms your membership at BYC and assures the club you will be visiting that your visit will be positive and problem free.

New Help for Kayakers

The Waterfront Committee has installed a device that can help you get in and out of your kayak while it is in the water.

This simple metal arm is now attached to the South end of the U-shaped floats. You simply lower the spring-loaded arm so it is under the water and slide your craft onto it. The arm helps stabilize the boat while you are boarding. When you are finished, just paddle up onto the arm and get out. Please raise the arm out of the water when you are done.

BYC Frostbite Kicks Off Season Sat., October 21

BYC Frostbite kicks off its 2023-24 season with the First Annual Stuffie Regatta on Saturday, October 21. Aero and Laser racers can sail in this one-day regatta without signing up for the entire season.

The first gun is 1PM. Stuffies, BBQ and awards ceremony for all attendees and guests will follow racing and derigging. The BYC bar will be open and the firepit will be blazing.

The cost of the regatta, as well as boat storage, is included in the registration fee for all racers who sign up for the full BYC Frostbite Season.

Aero and Laser racers are welcome to join this one-day event as a “day rate” sailor. High school students sail free. A signed Waiver of Liability is required for all sailors.

This year’s Fall Series will run from October 21 through December 16. The Winter Series starts January 6 and runs through March 23. Season awards and BBQ will follow the fun race on Saturday, March 30.

Last season 30 Laser and Aero racers from six New England States enjoyed 16 days of racing on Bristol Harbor during the Fall / Winter series. Frostbiters logged 1,000+ starts over 175 races. Seasonally warm weather, complete with “diamonds-on-the-bay,” key-noted most days.

Hidden within the Western sandbar of Hog Island is Butter and Brine Oysters owned and operated by Kyle Hess, whose family connection to Hog Island dates back hundreds of years. Here in the protected cove his pontoon-like cages float on the surface of a five-acre area of the bay cultivating deep-cupped oysters.

After taking an aquaculture course at Roger Williams University, Hess obtained the lease for the oyster farm in 2012.

Please mark your calendars now to participate in this important meeting. Your attention to and feedback on the Club's planning and operations are vital to the BYC's continued success.

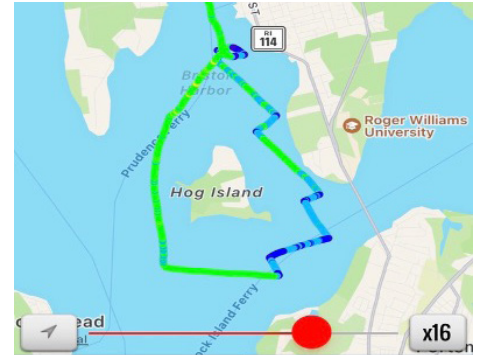


The Race Around Hog Island
