


The Commodore's Cup held every year during the July Fourth week in place of that week's regular Wednesday night Millard race. The course runs once around Hog Island with staggered start times, so boats of all sizes wind up racing against each other at the finish.

Students in the East Bay Sailing Foundation program will be invited to crew (or simply observe) on the boats that regularly compete in the Millard Series. For many, it's their first time aboard a vessel bigger than a Mercury.

For boat owners who do not race their boats in the Wednesday Night series, and even sailing families who've never run a race, you are invited to join the fun. The format is super easy: Just register beforehand with your boat's make and size, and you'll be assigned an exact start time based on your boat's handicap. You will need to have a basic understanding of race rules for safety and to know the racecourse. The race documents will be provided for this, plus any questions you have can be answered by the organizers. Then get out to the start/finish line at the south end of the mooring field before 6:00 PM on Wednesday, July 5, run the course, and afterward enjoy the post-race dinner in the Clubhouse.

Details and registration are on the club's website under Racing > BYC Regattas. Start planning now for what can be the highlight of your Bristol July Fourth week.
