# Come See the Ocean Race Fleet in Newport

BYC is joining The Ocean Race this year with the Club's first cruise of the season to Newport from May 19 - 21. Newport is where the fleet of racers for this year's Ocean Race will be based during an approximate 11-day stopover as they prepare for the sixth leg of the race from Newport, RI, to Aarhus, Denmark. BYC cruisers and members will have a unique opportunity to view the in-port race on Saturday and the start of this sixth leg on Sunday, May 21, at 2:00 PM when the fleet crosses the start line on their way to Europe.

While in Newport, the 60-foot, hydrofoil-assisted sailboats will be berthed at Fort Adams State Park for all to see up close. In addition to the yachts themselves, Newport will host visitors with a celebratory festival called the Live Ocean Park, which will be open to the public for free every day. Visitors will be able to tour team bases, Try Sailing! Onboard a Sail Newport J/22 and participate in an interactive ocean hologram exhibit on ocean stewardship. Enjoy music, food, children's activities, entertainment, cocktail cafes, and the stunning Fort Adams State Park with panoramic views of Newport Harbor and Narragansett Bay.

# What is the Ocean Race?

Formerly called the Volvo Ocean Race, it is often described as the longest and toughest professional sporting event in the world and as one of sailing's three most important global competitions (alongside the Olympics and America's Cup). The Ocean Race is a round-the-world sailing race that takes teams 45,000 nautical miles across four oceans, touching six continents and visiting 12 landmark host cities.

World Class Sailing Champion and BYC Member Charlie Enright is competing in this year's race as co-founder of 11th Hour Racing and Skipper of *Malama*, one of the yachts competing in this year's fleet.

After powering through the fierce Southern Ocean, the sailors have rounded Cape Horn and are now heading northward along the East Coast of South America. Charlie Enright and the crew aboard Malama, although suffering through equipment problems such as a torn mainsail, have managed to keep pace with rest of the fleet and it's still anyone's leg to win. After a stop in Itajai, Brazil, The Ocean Race should arrive in Newport between May 10 and 12.

BYC's May Cruise to Newport - Continued from page 4 there will be a dock-out ceremony followed by an in-port race from 2:00 PM - 4:00 PM. BYC members are invited to a group dinner at Stoneacre Garden in downtown Newport at 7:00 PM, which will include a two-course prix fixe menu for \$61.50 per person.

**Sunday, May 21 -** The Live Ocean Park will again be open from 10:00 AM to 7:00 PM, including the Exploration Zone. At 2:00 PM, the fleet will start the sixth leg of the race by crossing a start line off Fort Adams (TDB on the day of the race), heading north under the Newport Bridge, and then southwest out the Bay to Europe. BYC members can view the start from Fort Adams or in the Bay in

designated viewing areas outside of the defined race course. BYC members joining the cruise via water can return to Bristol at their leisure.

#### How to Register for the Cruise, Reserve a Mooring, and Sign Up for Dinner

Moorings can be reserved through Oldport Marine for \$50/night. Pre-payment for the first night is required. Anchoring is also possible in Newport's anchorage area at the southern end of the harbor, not far from Fort Adams and the Live Ocean Park festival.

Oldport Marine's launch service runs to all parts of the harbor at \$4 per head.

For the group dinner on Saturday night, the restaurant, Stoneacer Garden, is offering several menu options for the two-course dinner described <a href="here">here</a>. Dinner is \$61.50 (\$48/pp plus tax and tip).

# **Updated House Rules**

- Jane Guinther, House Committee Chairperson BYC's Clubhouse Rules have been updated. Please take a moment to read the new rules and keep them in mind going forward. The updated rules are provided below and will be posted on the Club website shortly.

- 1. The Clubhouse is open daily beginning of Launch hours to close of Chart Room hours between Commissioning and Decommissioning. The Chart Room is open to the membership at hours posted in this booklet, the Mainsheet and on the BYC website including during rental events.
- 2. Members seeking entry to the Clubhouse at other times during this period are advised to contact the Steward ahead of time to make arrangements.
- 3. No one under the legal drinking age is permitted in the Chart Room when the Club's bar is open, including during rental events.
- 4. Consumption of alcoholic beverages must be confined to those sold by our Club's bar. Liquor purchased at the Club must be consumed on the Club's premises. This rule does not apply to the consumption of alcoholic beverages from a yacht's locker while the yacht is at the Club's dock, provided consumption remains within the vicinity of the yacht. (Required to maintain the Club's liquor license.)
- 5. Only the Steward, his staff, or assigned persons by the Steward will be available to tend bar.
- 6. Intoxicated persons will not be served alcohol at the Club.
- 7. Shoes and shirts must be worn in the Clubhouse.
- 8. Wet clothing may not be worn in the Clubhouse.
- 9. Parents are responsible for the behavior of their children. Children under the age of 12 must be accompanied by a parent, guardian or designated responsible adult while on Club property.
- 10. Smoking in the Clubhouse and anywhere on the BYC property is not permitted except in a designated smoking area in the west side parking lot.
- 11. Rental of Club facilities can be arranged through the Club Steward, subject to approval by the Executive Committee.
- 12. Members are welcome to use the decks anytime. The upper deck is reserved for Club members including during rental events. Members are responsible for disposing of all garbage, trash, and recyclables after use.
- 13. Pets are not permitted in the Clubhouse or the Clubhouse's decks except for certified service animals.

#### New RI DEM Regulation Requires PDFs in All Paddle Craft as of April 2

All operators and passengers of canoes, kayaks, sailboards, kiteboards, paddleboards, and any other paddle craft must always wear a United States Coast Guard (USCG)-approved PFD while underway regardless of age. Read the press release announcing this change <a href="here.">here.</a>
